Eastern Virginia Medical School accepted it's first class in September 1973. From 1973 until 1983 the M.D. program was 36 months in length. Beginning in 1983, the M.D. program length was extended to 4 years.

TRANSCRIPT KEY (1973-1983)

The program leading to the M.D. degree at Eastern Virginia Medical School is 36 months in length and is composed of three phases. Phase I, 15 months in length, students acquire the fundamentals of basic sciences and physical diagnosis. Phase II students experience clerkships in six disciplines. Phase III is devoted entirely to selectives in basic and clinical sciences. Students are evaluated on their mastery of specified objectives in each organ system in Phase I, clinical clerkships in Phase III and selectives in Phase III. Each department may elect to submit written comments on student's individual performance. These comments are part of the transcript.

HONORS: Awarded to those who elect to participate in advance objectives as designed by the individual department. The designation was discontinued as of January 1, 1976.

COMPLETE: Received when all objectives assigned by the department have been mastered.

TRANSCRIPT KEY (1984-1986)

The program leading to the M.D. degree at Eastern Virginia Medical School is 36 months in length and is composed of three phases. Phase I, 15 months in length, students acquire the fundamentals of basic sciences and physical diagnosis. Phase II students experience clerkships in six disciplines. The final year consists of 12 weeks of required clinical experiences and 20 weeks of elective experiences. Students are evaluated on the achievement of course objectives and grades are assigned using a modified norm-reference system.

PASS: Received when all objectives assigned have been mastered.

FAIL: Received when the student fails to meet the assigned objectives. The course may be repeated the following year.

TRANSCRIPT KEY (1988-1989)

The first year of approximately 40 weeks is presented in an integrated fashion providing students with a firm foundation in normal structure and function of the body. The second year or approximately 35 weeks is also presented in an integrated fashion providing students with an understanding of the biology of disease, abnormal structure and function. During the third year, students rotate through 48 weeks of required clinical experiences (clerkships) in six disciplines. The final year consists of 8 weeks of required clinical experiences and 24 weeks of elective experiences. Students are evaluated on the achievement of course objectives and grades are assigned using a modified norm-reference system.

The final year consists of 7 weeks of required clinical experiences and 25 weeks of elective experiences. Students are evaluated on the achievement of course objectives and grades are assigned using a modified norm-reference system.
